The Arizona Board of Regents, the governing board for the Arizona University System, invites nominations, inquiries, and applications for the position of President of The University of Arizona (UA).

Located in Tucson, Arizona, UA is one of the nation's leading public universities and has a long history of academic excellence, research innovation, and student success. The University of Arizona, a member of the Association of American Universities, is ranked by the National Science Foundation as 25th among all universities and 15th among public universities in research expenditures.

Enrollment at The University of Arizona is about 37,000 students on three campuses, and the annual budget is approaching \$1.5 billion. Capital projects underway amount to \$290 million, and another \$271 million in projects are in the design phase. "Campaign Arizona," recently completed, raised \$1.2 billion.

Leading candidates will have records of distinguished achievement in higher education or related fields of endeavor and will possess demonstrated abilities to address the multi-faceted challenges that will confront The University of Arizona in the next decade. They will be familiar with and strongly committed to research universities that emphasize high-quality undergraduate teaching, graduate and professional education, and public service integrated with leading-edge research and scholarship. They will possess a record of strong commitment to and positive action on issues relating to diversity. Business acumen and entrepreneurial vision are important attributes to possess to lead effectively a large, public university, such as The University of Arizona.

Leading candidates also will have a keen ability to articulate and advance the university's mission and purpose in collaboration with faculty, students, staff, and in concert with the other two public universities in the System. They must also be able to effectively communicate the needs, achievements, and contributions of a large, land grant university to the Board of Regents, the Legislature, and the citizens of the state.

Regent Fred Boice is Chair of the UA Presidential Search Committee. Because of the current president's retirement, Regents expect the appointment to this position to be effective July 1, 2006. Assisting in the conduct of this search are Ann Die Hasselmo, Ph.D., and Stan O. Ikenberry, Ph.D., of Academic Search Consultation Service.
